**I. PURPOSE**

To outline the steps to select a candidate or candidates for the Emergency Nurses Association (ENA) California State Council Scholarship Award. This award is given annually in memory of Daniel Kelleher.

**II. PROCEDURE**

This scholarship will be awarded in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1000) to a qualified applicant who is seeking to further his or her nursing education to a baccalaureate degree or higher. This scholarship may also be divided between two (2) or more applicants at the discretion of the State Council Board of Directors.

- A. Any member of the California Emergency Nurses Association may apply.
- B. Applicants must meet the following criteria:
1. Current national ENA member;
  2. Current professional nursing licensure in the state of California; and
  3. Currently enrolled or accepted at a National League of Nursing accredited school. Proof of enrollment or acceptance must be submitted with the application.
- C. Applications must be submitted to the State Council President in writing on or before the due date as announced by the President at a regularly scheduled State Council meeting.
- D. Written application must include:
1. *Curriculum Vitae*;
  2. Letter of intent to include
    - \*How the profession of emergency nursing will benefit from your education
    - \*Your involvement in ENA including all offices held or positions to which you have been appointed; and
  3. Photocopy or other proof of enrollment or acceptance at a National League of Nursing accredited school.
