CA AB 7 Huffman (D)	<p>High School Baseball Safety Act of 2010 Enacts the High School Baseball Safety Act of 2010. Expresses the findings and declarations of the Legislature regarding the safety implications of the use of nonwooden bats in high school baseball. Prohibits the use of a nonwooden baseball bat at a private or public high school competitive baseball game or practice or during a physical education class or activity conducted at a private or public high school.</p> <p>POSITION: F</p>	<p>05/11/2010:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In SENATE. CA AB 511 De La Torre (D)	<p>Medi-Cal: Ambulance Providers: Quality Assurance Fees Imposes a quality assurance fee on ambulance transportation providers for participation in the Medi-Cal program. Provides the fee would be deposited into a related fund. Provides the fees would be deposited into the Medi-Cal Ambulance Transportation Services Providers Fund and used to enhance federal financial participation for ambulance transportation services under Medi-Cal or to provide additional reimbursement to, and to support quality improvement efforts of, ambulance services providers.</p> <p>POSITION: F</p>	<p>01/07/2010:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Re-referred to SENATE Committees on HEALTH and REVENUE AND TAXATION.
CA AB 542 Feuer (D)	<p>Hospital Acquired Conditions Requires the medical director and the director of nursing of a hospital to annually report adverse events and hospital acquired conditions to its governing board. Requires the convening of a technical working group to evaluate implementing nonpayment policies for hospital acquired conditions under Medi-Cal. Requires certain managed care plans contracted with the Managed Risk Medical Insurance Board to implement nonpayment policies for such conditions consistent with Medi-Cal policies.</p> <p>POSITION: S</p>	<p>06/30/2010:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> From SENATE Committee on HEALTH: Do pass as amended to Committee on APPROPRIATIONS.
CA AB 1272 Hill (D)	<p>Emergency Medical Services: Trauma Center: Helicopters Permits an emergency medical services agency to submit a request of notification to a city, county, or city and county for notice of any zoning variance, permit, amendment, or entitlement for use that would permit the construction and operation of a heliport or helipad on the property of a general acute care hospital. Permits the agency to prepare a specified report, consult with city, county, or city and county representatives regarding that report, and to provide written comments and appear at a hearing.</p> <p>POSITION: S</p>	<p>06/24/2010:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Withdrawn from SENATE Committee on LOCAL GOVERNMENT. <p>CA AB 1443 Huffman (D)</p>	<p>Driving Under the Influence: Repeat Offenders Requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to permanently revoke the driver's license of a person who was previously convicted of three or more specified DUI offenses. Prohibits a person whose driver's license is permanently revoked from registering a vehicle in the state. Authorizes a person who had only three previous convictions and whose license was permanently revoked to petition the court for reinstatement of the privilege to drive after a specified period of time under certain conditions. <p>CA AB 1600 Beall (D)</p>	<p>Health Care Coverage: Mental Health Services Expands coverage requirements for certain health care service plan contracts and health insurance policies issued, amended, or renewed on or after a specified date, to include the diagnosis and treatment of a mental illness of a person of any age. Defines mental illness for this purpose as a mental disorder defined in the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual IV, subject to regulatory revision. Specifies that such benefit or contract does not apply to the Board of Administration of the PERS program. <p>CA AB 1652 Jones (D)</p>	<p>Public Safety: Ski Resorts Requires a person under a certain age or a person employed by a ski resort to wear a properly fitted and fastened snow sport helmet while operating snow skis or a snowboard. Requires resorts to inform all patrons at the time of ticket or pass purchase of the requirement. Requires the resort in to revoke the ticket or pass of a patron who violates the requirement; Preserves the existing assumption of the risk doctrine as it applies to ski resorts. <p>CA AB 1882 Portantino (D)</p>	<p>Health Facilities: Chilling or Therapeutic Hypothermia Requires each general acute care hospital with an emergency department to adopt a protocol or policy establishing a procedure for assessing patients in the emergency room who are comatose after experiencing cardiac arrest to determine whether to treat these patients with chilling or therapeutic hypothermia. Imposes additional requirements upon the hospital if it undertakes this treatment. <p>CA AB 2153 Lieu (D)</p>	<p>Emergency Room Crowding Requires every licensed general acute care hospital with an emergency department to determine the range of crowding scores that constitute each category of the crowding scale for its emergency department. POSITION: N</p>	<p>06/30/2010: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In SENATE. Read second time. To third reading. </p>

<p>CA AB 2173 Beall (D)</p>	<p>Emergency Air Medical Transportation Providers Creates the Emergency Air Medical Transportation Act. Imposes an additional penalty upon every conviction for an offense involving a vehicle violation. Requires the establishment of emergency medical air transportation act funds by each county and provides for the deposit of the additional motor vehicle penalties into such funds. Provides for disbursement of moneys in such funds for the purpose of augmenting Medi-Cal reimbursement paid to emergency air medical transportation services providers. <p>CA AB 2248 Hernandez (D)</p>	<p>Emergency Medical Care Amends existing law that authorizes a county to establish an emergency medical services fund for reimbursement of emergency medical services (EMS) related costs and requires an annual report to the Legislature. Requires such report to provide additional information regarding the moneys collected and disbursed, including a description of other medical services purposes. <p>CA AB 2387 Miller (R)</p>	<p>County Jails: Inmate Emergency Health Care Amends existing law that authorizes a county sheriff, police chief, or other public agency that contracts for emergency health services, to contract with providers of emergency health care services for care to local law enforcement patients. <p>CA AB 2456 Torrice (D)</p>	<p>Emergency Medical Services: Regulation Specifies that the regulations of the Emergency Medical Services Authority (EMSA), shall include policies and procedures applicable to the functions, certification, and licensure of all emergency medical technician personnel. Requires local EMS agencies to adhere to these standards. Provides that any policies and procedures of a local EMS agency that are not in accordance with these standards are subject to approval by the EMSA. Provides an appeal procedure. <p>CA AB 2600 Ma (D)</p>	<p>Medicine: Licensing: Continuing Education Requirements Amends existing law that requires the Medical Board of California to establish continuing education requirements for physicians and surgeons, and requires the board to consider including various courses in determining its continuing education requirements. Requires the board to consider including a continuing education course in the diagnosis and treatment of hepatitis. <p>CA AB 2667 Hill (D)</p>	<p>Vehicles: Child Passenger Restraint Systems Requires a public or private hospital, clinic, or birthing center, at the time the child is discharged, to discuss information on where, and at no cost, the child passenger restraint system can be inspected and proper installation instruction can be given, by providing appropriate contact information, including, among other things, the telephone number of the local office of the Department of the California Highway Patrol. <p>CA SB 177 Lowenthal A (D)</p>	<p>Vehicles: Child Passengers Relates to existing law which permits a child under 6 who weighs less than 60 pounds to ride in the front seat of a motor vehicle if the child is secured in a child passenger restraint system that meets federal safety standards, under specified circumstances, including if all rear seats are already occupied by children under the age of 12 years. Provides that, for purposes of allowing certain children to sit in the front seat, lowers the age of the children occupying the rear seats to 8 years. <p>CA SB 733 Leno (D)</p>	<p>Crime Victims: Trauma Center Grants Relates to the Victim Compensation and Government Claims Board. Authorizes the board to administer a program to award, upon appropriation by the Legislature, up to a specified amount of funds in grants, annually, to trauma centers. <p>CA SB 880 Yee (D)</p>	<p>Public Safety: Snow Sport Helmets Requires a person under 18 years of age to wear a properly fitted and fastened snow sport helmet while operating snow skis or a snowboard, or while riding upon a seat or other device that is attached to snow skis or a snowboard while participating in either sport. Imposes a specified fine. Provides that the charge against a person be dismissed if it is the first charge for a violation of this requirement. Requires the resort to post signs of the helmet requirement on maps and the resort Internet Web sites. <p>CA SB 1187 Strickland T (R)</p>	<p>Human Experimentation Amends an existing law that prohibits any person from being subjected to any medical experiment unless the informed consent of the person is obtained, and provides an exemption from the law for any medical experimental treatment that benefits a patient subject to a life-threatening emergency if prescribed conditions are met. Provides that the exemption shall remain in effect until a specified date. POSITION: S</p>	<p>06/29/2010: • Enrolled.</p>

<p>CA SB 1281 Padilla (D)</p>	<p>Emergency Medical Services: Defibrillators Repeals provisions that authorized the Emergency Medical Services Authority to establish minimum training and other standards for the uses of automatic external defibrillators and requires persons or entities that acquire the defibrillators to comply with maintenance, testing and training requirements, and provisions that sets forth tenant notice and other requirements for building owners in which such equipment is placed. <p>CA SB 1475 Simitian (D)</p>	<p>Vehicles: Electronic Wireless Communications Devices Requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to include a test of the applicant's understanding of the distractions and dangers of handheld cell phone use and text messaging while operating a motor vehicle. Deletes the exemption from the violation point count that would be given for a conviction of text-based communications. Revises related fines for violations including while riding a bicycle. Requires fines to be used for driver education. Allows stopping a vehicle for cellphone use determination. POSITION: F</p>	<p>06/23/2010: • In ASSEMBLY. Read second time and amended.
